

## Shooting Rules

---

1. Only Persons with the appropriate shooting qualification and that have permission from the District Commissioner may lead activities in the rifle range. This Person must be in attendance at all times the rifle range is unlocked.
2. Shooting certificates must be shown to the duty warden prior to the activity commencing.
3. Agreement to having read and understood these rules and the risk assessment must be signed for by the instructor before commencement of the activity, whom will be liable for the duration of the activity booking.
4. It is the responsibility of the instructor to ensure the correct permission to shoot paperwork has been obtained for all persons under 18 years.
5. The instructor must ensure that adequate first aid cover is available during the activity.
6. The range must be locked and the rifles must be locked in the gun cabinet at all times the range is not supervised.
7. Safety glasses must be worn by all persons past the waiting line.
8. All spectators must remain behind the wall and stand behind the Perspex screen while shooting is taking place.
9. All persons handling lead pellets should be advised to wash their hands after the activity and to avoid putting their fingers in their mouth or eyes.
10. The activity must be run in accordance with POR.
11. All equipment must be checked before use.
12. Activities must be stopped immediately if horseplay could cause a risk to Safety.
13. Safety is priority at all times in the Range.
